Medication Management & Controlled Substances Policy

Sunflower Mountain Mental Health (SMMH)

Effective Date: January 1, 2025

Purpose

This policy ensures the safe and compliant prescribing, monitoring, and management of **controlled substances** at Sunflower Mountain Mental Health (SMMH). The policy aligns with **DEA, Medicare, Medicaid, and Colorado state regulations** while safeguarding patients from misuse, dependency, and diversion.

Controlled Substance Prescribing & Compliance

SMMH providers will prescribe controlled substances only when:

- Medically necessary and appropriate for the patient's condition.
- In compliance with DEA Schedule II-V regulations.
- **Supported by thorough clinical documentation,** including history, diagnosis, and treatment plan.
- Within safe prescribing limits, as determined by FDA guidelines and clinical best practices.
- In adherence to Colorado's Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP).

Patient Responsibilities & Informed Consent

Patients prescribed controlled substances must:

- Sign the **Controlled Substance Policy Agreement** before receiving a prescription.
- Disclose all medications (including over-the-counter and supplements).
- Use only one **designated pharmacy** unless explicitly authorized by their provider.
- Store medications securely to prevent loss, theft, or misuse.
- Not share, sell, or alter medications under any circumstances.

Prescription Monitoring & Safety Protocols

To ensure responsible prescribing, SMMH providers will:

- Conduct routine PDMP checks before prescribing.
- Require follow-up appointments for medication renewals.
- Limit prescriptions to **30-day supplies** unless medically justified.
- Require urine drug screening and random pill counts as needed.

• Assess for potential drug interactions, misuse, or dependency.

Controlled Substances & Additional Requirements

While this policy applies to **all prescribed medications**, additional restrictions and monitoring protocols exist for **controlled substances** (Schedule II-V medications), including stimulants, benzodiazepines, and opioids. Patients prescribed controlled substances must also adhere to the **Controlled Substance Management Policy**, which includes:

- Controlled medication agreements and patient responsibilities.
- Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) compliance.
- Random drug screening and refill limitations.

Refill Policy

- Controlled substances will not be refilled early unless there is a documented medical necessity.
- Refills require an in-person or telehealth visit, unless otherwise approved by the provider.
- Patients are responsible for scheduling follow-up appointments before running out of medication.

Prohibited & High-Risk Medication Practices

SMMH does not routinely prescribe:

- Long-term benzodiazepine therapy (except in rare, justified cases with structured taper plans).
- Concurrent prescriptions of benzodiazepines & opioids due to high overdose risk.
- **High-dose stimulant prescriptions** beyond FDA-approved limits.
- Multiple controlled substances in combination unless clinically necessary.

Medication Misuse & Termination of Care

SMMH reserves the right to discontinue controlled substance treatment if:

- Patients **fail to comply** with medication agreements.
- **Urine drug screening shows inconsistencies** (e.g., missing prescribed medications or detecting unreported substances).
- Multiple providers prescribe the same controlled substance without provider knowledge.
- The patient engages in diversion, misuse, or illegal distribution.

Emergency Medication & Lost Prescriptions

- Lost, stolen, or damaged medications will not be replaced without clear documentation (e.g., police report).
- Emergency refills will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Medication Disposal Requirements

- Patients should dispose of unused or expired medications following FDA disposal guidelines.
- SMMH encourages use of **DEA-approved medication disposal sites**.

Compliance & Monitoring

- Annual provider training on controlled substance prescribing and DEA regulations.
- Regular audits of prescribing patterns to detect potential misuse.
- Random patient monitoring, including drug screenings and prescription history reviews.
